#### Spices making workshop:-

To provide chances of Business, to earn money at home for women/girl students institute organize spices making workshop in campus about 42 women's/ girls students participated in this workshop, This workshop encourages 10 women to start their business at home in vaijapur.

#### Problems Encountered and Resources Required:-

Institute is purely on non-grant, self-finance based and the most of the girls students are from rural area therefore lack of awareness about business in these students, hence limited women's/girl students are participated in training.

- Organization of such programs in campus during working hours has hampered class work.

- To provide affordable services to rural people such as free medical checkup ,free medical treatments, free medicine etc.
- To provide health examinations and test at early stages of the illness to cure disease.

#### The Context:-

The rural poor people are not aware about their health as well the present medical expenses cannot afford by the poor people there fore need to organize free medical camp in rural area which helps to take care of their health, as health care is a basic right of human being that should be available for everyone, therefore institute conducts free medical campus and provide the medical facilities to underprivileged community for their live longer and healthier.

#### The Practice:-

Vaijapur is a town surrounded by many villages all these villages are depends on agriculture and most of the people are farmers or farm labors with low income sources and they are not aware about Hygiene, Sanitation and health also and not able to take the treatment from medical Practitioners, hence institute take measure to bring awareness among these people about their health and provide free medical facilities to rural, poor needy people regularly. Institute organizes different free health camps in collaboration with hospitals specialized doctors from Aurangabad and Nashik area in these camps free medical checkup about B.P. Diabetes, ENT, kidney diseases, Dental problems, eyes, cataract diagnosis is given to rural people as well as medicines and further treatment is also given to needy people.

  rural area hence rural people avail the support unit of these camps and about 1760 people of rural
